

Student Dress Standards

- ❖ Student dress standards are to reflect school community standards and are consistent with occupational health and safety and anti-discrimination legislation.
- ❖ Students are encouraged to take pride in their personal appearance and grooming.
- ❖ The school uniform is to be worn at all appropriate times
- ❖ The only acceptable forms of jewellery to be worn with the uniform are wrist watches, plain sleeper earrings and studs in pierced ears. (Bracelets, neck chains, rings and dangling earrings pose a safety threat in practical lessons such as Physical Education and Manufacturing. Such jewellery is to be handed to the teacher who will return it at the end of the school day).
- ❖ No eye makeup or lipstick is to be worn at school. If students feel it necessary to use nail varnish, it should be clear. Sunscreen and skin coloured foundation products can be used for protection.
- ❖ Neat trimmed facial hair is acceptable.
- ❖ Specific footwear to be worn at all times. Thongs or sandals are not permitted.
- ❖ Deviations from the school uniform should be explained in a note addressed to the Deputy Principal, advising why full school uniform is not being worn. (Medical reasons for wearing alternative footwear should be substantiated by a doctor's certificate.)
- ❖ Students who consistently refuse to co-operate with accepted standards of dress may deny themselves opportunities to participate in certain activities because of the inappropriateness of such dress for the activity and will be made do detention in morning tea and lunchtime breaks.

Students in Years 10 - 12 must wear formal uniform on Assembly Day and other formal occasions. Sports uniform is allowed to be worn on other days. Closed in, non-porous shoes must be brought to school for appropriate classes and daily for Middle School students.

Year 12 students will be permitted to wear their senior jerseys as ordered through the school.

School uniforms may be obtained from RK Thomas Pty Ltd, Pittsworth and Millmerran.

Boys

Formal Uniform Years 10 - 12

- Trousers: Grey shorts or optional college grey long trousers. Jeans are not permitted. In winter, navy blue track pants may be worn.
- Shirt: Royal blue shirt, short sleeves (can be worn over shorts).
- Socks: Long grey socks with royal blue and gold stripe.
- Shoes: Black, full leather upper, polished (not suede), lace-up shoes. Black leather with air holes or composite/synthetic material sports shoes with/without air holes are not permitted.
- Jumper: Long-sleeved, V-neck, navy blue pullover with embroidered or printed school logo. Alternative is royal blue, navy and gold front-zipped school jacket
- Tie: Senior (Year 12) boys are to wear a tie, royal blue with gold stripe.

Girls

Formal Uniform Years 10 - 12

- Skirt: Royal blue skirt of terylene or cesarine material, with waist band. 10cm box pleat centre front and back, 2.5cm knife pleat each side of box pleat front and back. Hem of skirt to fall at least two-thirds of measurement from top of thigh to knees. Jeans are not permitted. In winter, navy blue track pants may be worn.
- Shorts: Tailored royal blue shorts are optional – No Jeans. Navy blue track pants.
- Blouse: Blue, gold and white check stripe.
- Socks: Summer - short white socks.
Winter - navy or fawn stockings (optional).
- Shoes: Black, full leather upper, polished (not suede), lace-up shoes.

Black leather with air holes or composite/synthetic material sports shoes with/without air holes are not permitted.

Jumper: Long-sleeved, V-neck, navy blue pullover with embroidered or printed school logo. Alternative is royal blue, navy and gold front-zipped school jacket.

Tie: Senior (Year 12) girls are to wear the plain royal blue tie.

School badges are available at the Office for \$5.50 (incl GST).

Blazer: Optional. Royal blue blazer with monogram pocket.

For teams, such as Debating Teams, there are a limited number of blazers available for students to borrow during competitions.

Day Uniform Year 8 and 9, PE / Sports Uniform Year 10 - 12

Tracksuits: Navy pants (no extraneous colours - fluoro or "designer" flashes, apart from optional gold) and front-zipped school jacket (royal blue, navy and gold).

Shorts: Navy blue "unisex" long-legged shorts, elasticised waist.

Shirt: Pittsworth State High School polo shirt (navy, royal blue and gold).

Sports Socks: Short white or ankle socks (not long socks).

Joggers: Closed in, non-porous shoes that meet the workplace health and safety minimum standards for specialist areas (refer Special Requirements Regarding shoes).

Students must wear a suitable hat and sunscreen when outdoors.

Special Requirements Regarding Shoes

Government Workplace Health & Safety regulations require students to wear closed in, non porous shoes to all practical arts lessons (ie: Science, Manual Arts, Home Economics, Art, etc). See Uniform section for requirements.

Students will be denied access to Science, Manual Arts and other relevant classes if incorrect footwear is worn.
